CLASSICS THAT STAY IN STYLE

This project was one of our favourites - one we come back to time and time again. We completed it back in 2016, but like all classics, it never goes out of style.

This architecturally designed home had many features and finishes that the clients loved and wanted to retain. The goal was to enhance the home's existing character that the clients fell in love with while making changes to complement their lifestyle.

For this busy family, home is a precious retreat from their hectic schedules. They travel often, so the time they spend here is truly treasured.

Some renovations involve creating more open space. However, we appreciated how these clients wanted to keep the home's original layout, such as keeping the dining room separate.



Every decision was meticulously crafted to maximize the space's potential. Consider this feature wall highlighted above: the handmade tile boasts an elegant and understated design, complemented by the walnut surround that frames it beautifully. This thoughtful design not only adds aesthetic appeal but also enables us to discreetly incorporate electrical outlets without disrupting the tile's integrity.

Additionally, we strategically installed transient windows above, seamlessly extending natural light from the dining room into the kitchen. This clever addition enhances the overall brightness and ambiance of the space.



Prior to the renovation, the kitchen windows were mostly hidden. With some strategic layout changes, these windows are now a highlight of the room.

Today, these windows provide the family's favorite view. It brings more light into the space, creating a better view, inside and out.





Optimizing Space for Family Living

In revamping the layout, we wanted to make sure it fit the family's lifestyle. One area of concern was the original laundry room. It was a largely unused space adjacent to the kitchen.

Instead, we moved it upstairs to an unused bedroom. Having the laundry upstairs simply made sense, especially for a busy family with little ones.

With that extra room downstairs, we got creative. We turned part of it into a drop zone by the back door, added a built-in pantry in the kitchen, and even squeezed in a butler's pantry. The other half became part of the kitchen, letting in more light and opening up those stunning views.
